Dear Parishioners,

These have been difficult years. We have been part of a global challenge to limit the impact of a severe and easily transmitted viral infection whose effects range from moderate illness through to death in some tragic cases. In our attempts to keep each other safe we have endured separations from loved ones and often from our 'homelands', people have suffered income losses, massive adaptations of family and educational life, and we have lived with the social impacts and mental health consequences of these same strategies.

I often reflect that Covid conversations seem to surround us still, and I dare say that if there was a list of, most used terms in 2020/21 then words like 'covid' & 'lockdowns' would easily top such a list. While there is a 'covid cloud' around, it is also true to say that in our own state of SA we have enjoyed great freedoms at this time compared to many parts of the world and for that we can be thankful.

However, let us not forego the very practices that have made such freedom possible. Thus, as the state opens to more travelers, and to greater risks of infection, we are reminded by our Archbishop to continue to adhere to the standards and practices we have in place. Please remember to continue sanitising our hands, thank you for adhering to the mandatory wearing of masks and signing in with a QR code or manually.

It is good also to see that the percentage of our state that is now double vaccinated is still growing and we are well on target to reach our goal of a mostly vaccinated population. Vaccination will keep not only those we love safer but will protect the most vulnerable of our society and is to be encouraged as an act for the common good of society. This view is in keeping with those of Pope Francis, who is vaccinated himself, and who has encouraged people to get vaccinated for this very same reason – to protect one's neighbour and society at large.

For some there may be questions about the moral status of using vaccines developed from cell lines of foetuses. This issue has also been studied at Vatican level, and the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, has declared that all of the Covid-19 vaccines recognised as clinically safe can be used in good conscience. To make use of vaccines today is not in any way a formal cooperation with a past action. Pope Francis has reiterated this view himself.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

During the height of COVID-19 restrictions the Parish Pastoral Council continued to meet via Zoom and when able they met in person. This year was a little better and the focus was asking for new volunteers and for the better part it was successful but it was difficult at times to implement all that the Council wanted to achieve. Over the last couple of years a few members were due for retirement, but the Council felt that because it hadn't been possible to meet regularly we asked these members if they would continue on for another term or at least another year, which means they will retire in 2022. They accepted this request, therefore nominations for new members will now be called for in October 2022.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE GLEN OSMOND/PARKSIDE

For the period January to October 2021, Conference members responded to 156 requests for assistance. The average monetary assistance provided was \$75 per request. Over \$1,000 in value of clothing was provided from the Vinnies shops.
