DATES & BELLS

School bell times for play, rest, nourishment and dismissal.

School starts at 8:30am. Students who need to be dropped off before this time are to be booked into Out of School Hours Care (OSHC). The morning bell rings at 8:50am. Please ensure all students arrive at school ready for the start of classes at 8:50am. It is important that all children arrive on time to prevent disruption to the class routine. Recess is at 11:10am, and lunch is at 12:30pm. School dismissal is at 3:10pm, and supervision ends at 3:30pm. Any child remaining after 3:30pm will be taken to OSHC, where fees will apply.

Front Office Hours

Please note our front office is open from 8:30am to 4:00pm during school terms.

Health and safety of your children

If your child is unwell or has a medical appointment and will be absent or late to school, we ask you to please notify the school before 9am by calling 8274 4900, emailing absent@raph.catholic.edu.au If your child arrives after 8:50am, they need to report to the front office with you (the parent/caregiver), and you will need to electronically sign them in. If your child needs to leave school early, they must obtain parental permission first, then you (the parent/caregiver) must sign them out electronically at the front office. To ensure we can reach you in the event

of an emergency, please keep your contact details up-to-date throughout the year. We appreciate your cooperation in following these procedures as your child's

safety is our top priority.

DROPOFF AND PICK UP

Parking Information

Parking is available on the streets surrounding the school, and we ask that you read the parking signs before leaving your car. The carpark at the front of the school is priority parking for staff.

Kiss and Drop Area

Our kiss and drop area on Macklin Street was created to allow a smooth and safe process of stopping to let your child out of the car. Parents are reminded that this is not a parking zone, and if your child is not able to exit or enter the car by themselves, we ask that you park on the surrounding streets and walk up to the school to drop them off or pick them up.

NEED TO KNOW

Cybersafety

We advise a strict no device policy on school grounds, including iPhones, Smart Phones or Smart watches. If your child has any devices at school, for safety reasons they must be handed in to the class teacher in the morning and collected at the end of the day.

Bullying

We have a zero-tolerance policy for all instances of bullying or harassment. Fostering a respectful environment is of utmost importance to us. We encourage open conversations and proactive conflict resolution through healthy dialogue. Our aim is to instill restorative practices that build a community grounded in mutual respect for one another.

Sun Smart School

To keep children safe from harmful UV Rays, we adhere to a 'no hat no play' policy between August 1 and April 30. We ensure that sunscreen is available to apply sunscreen at home before coming to school.





Homework

Homework is a key part of the learning journey. It allows students to practice what they've learned in class and build those awesome study habits. Each teacher will share their homework approach with you. We understand that families have busy schedules, so students will have plenty of time to complete their assignments. If homework ever feels too challenging for your student, just reach out to their teacher. We're here to support you and make homework a positive experience!

Is everything labelled?

Things do get misplaced or left behind by students, and our experience shows that if something is labeled, it will invariably reach its owner in due course.

Assessment and Reporting

Educators constantly evaluate pupils' advancement through oral, written assessments and observations, developing a comprehensive understanding of each learner's progress. Scheduled parent-teacher interviews occur in Terms 1 and 3, while formal written reports are distributed in Terms 2 and 4. Parents can arrange additional conferences with their child's teacher at any time.

Special Days





















SCHOOL UNIFORM
