The situation in the Middle East

Your children may become concerned about the situation in the Middle East particularly if they see or hear accounts from social media. Staff have been provided with advice in relation to supporting children who may be concerned about this situation. My guidance to staff has been:

- NOT to raise this with students unless they do first.
- There is considerable public sensitivity in the media around blame and so to use the words "complex and tragic" to describe what is happening and not allow a conversation about blame.
- This could be a good time to pray for everyone affected by this.
- Sometimes students are looking for a simple, reassuring conversation, but if there are more significant concerns then we have a school counsellor on site. Either way, staff will contact you if your child expresses a concern.


World Teacher's Day

Jake and Max:




