A Bright and Inspired Start: Celebrating Our Academic Success



At St Raphael's, we pride ourselves on delivering a "bright and inspired start" for every child. This promise reflects our commitment to nurturing strong foundations for lifelong learning. In 2024, two key assessments highlighted just how well our students are thriving academically: the Phonics Screening Check and the newly introduced Number Check by Catholic Education South Australia (CESA).

The Phonics Screening Check, conducted across the state each year, is a vital tool that evaluates how well children are grasping foundational literacy skills. Strong results in phonics often correlate with future academic success, as these skills underpin reading and writing development. We are thrilled to share that 100% of St Raphael's students exceeded the desired benchmark. We also outperformed the state, CESA and Eastern Region with our school average being significantly higher. This extraordinary achievement is a testament to the dedication of our teachers, the strength of our literacy programs, and the active support of our parent community.

In 2024, CESA expanded its focus on early learning with the rollout of a Number Check. Designed to assess foundational numeracy skills, this initiative ensures children build confidence and competence in mathematics from the very beginning of their educational journey. **Once again, St Raphael's students shone brightly, achieving results well above** the state, CESA, and Eastern Region averages.

These outstanding outcomes reflect the quality of education at St Raphael's and underscore our unwavering commitment to academic rigour. Every child is encouraged and supported to achieve their best, with a curriculum tailored to foster curiosity, resilience, and excellence.

We celebrate these results with immense gratitude for the partnership between our skilled educators and our engaged families. Together, we are shaping confident learners who are ready to embrace the challenges and opportunities of the future. Thank you for being part of the St Raphael's community, where every child truly begins their journey with a bright and inspired start.
