- Develop digital literacy skills

Resources and Engagement:

- Utilise library resources, including interactive kits
- · Make reading interactive with props and sound-enhanced books

Attend library events and use community resources

Fostering Creativity:

- Explore diverse stories reflecting various identities
- Use wordless books to spark imagination
- · Encourage illustration skills through copying exercises

Reading Techniques:

- Implement "Think Aloud," "Turn & Talk," and "Act It Out" strategies
- Incorporate reading into daily life through small, frequent sessions

For Older Students:

• Share novels with adults, reading chapters aloud together


Behind the Scenes Heroes
